Reigate Hill

We have received several reports over the past few weeks of a group of men on e-bikes throwing stones at passing vehicles from the Reigate Hill footbridge and the Reigate Hill M25 flyover.

A man in his 20s has now been arrested on suspicion of conspiracy to cause criminal damage and causing danger to road users and is currently in police custody.

Our enquiries are ongoing, and we are still looking for anyone who might have witnessed these offences to come forward. If you have any dashcam or helmet cam footage that may have captured all or part of these incidents taking place please get in touch quoting PR/45250066524.

These offences have mostly taken place between 10pm and 1.30am. If you see any persons in the area around the Reigate Hill footbridge during this time and think they have either been throwing stones at vehicles or are about to do so, call 999.

Salfords

We are appealing for witnesses after a man was assaulted near Salfords Rail Station on Thursday 29 May at around 10.45pm.

The victim was walking down an alleyway directly opposite Salfords Station, when he was approached by two men who pushed him into a fence. A further four men then approached the victim and they proceeded to assault him, before running away.

Five of the suspects are described as white men wearing hoodies.

One suspect has been described as a black man wearing a hoodie.

3 How to report – Environment Crime



Incidents you need to report to either a council or utility company

Noise pollution. This needs to be reported to your local council. [Find your local council.](#)

Waste and litter. Litter and waste dumps need to be reported to your local council. [Find your local council.](#)

Fly tipping. Fly tipping, the dumping of waste, needs to be reported to the local council. [Find your local council.](#)

Pests You can contact your council to find out if they offer services to control pests like wasps, rats, mice or bedbugs. [Find your local council.](#)

Discarded syringes or drug paraphernalia Your local council will arrange for syringes and drug paraphernalia left in public to be removed. [Find your local council.](#)

Dangerous buildings or structures. You can report dangerous buildings or structures to your local council. [Find your local council.](#)

Burst water mains. Who to report this to, your council, the environment agency or the utility company, depends on the circumstances. [Gov.uk](#) gives a useful breakdown of who to contact.

Garden bonfires. There's no law against having a bonfire in your garden, but there are laws on the nuisance they can cause. Find more information on [Gov.uk](#).

The Environment Agency - in England only

Call the Environment Agency incident hotline to report:

- damage or danger to the natural environment
- pollution to water or land
- poaching or illegal fishing
- dead fish or fish gasping for air
- main rivers blocked by a vehicle or fallen tree causing risk of flooding
- flooding from any river, stream, canal, natural spring or the sea
- incidents at Environment Agency-regulated waste sites
- illegal removals from watercourses
- unusual changes in river flow
- collapsed or badly damaged river or canal banks

Report it to us

Illegal fishing including:

- fishing on any watercourse without permission
- theft of fish from ponds and canals
- capture of protected glass eels

Call [999](#) if you know these crimes are happening now.

[Report online](#) if the crimes are not happening now.

Contact the Environment Agency for other fishing related incidents like fishing without a licence or using incorrect equipment.

Large scale dumping or hazardous waste

We need to know about large scale illegal dumping (where lorries are being used to dump rubbish), someone running a waste site without a permit or not following the rules of a waste management permit. [Report this online](#). If you're aware of hazardous waste that's an immediate danger to the public, report it to us straight away by [calling 999](#). If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use our textphone service 18000 or text us on 999 if you've pre-registered with the [emergencySMS service](#).

We have received reports of cars being broken into, with thieves looking for valuables.

Please do NOT leave any valuables in your vehicles and make sure vehicles are locked and secured by checking the handle, not just pressing key fob.

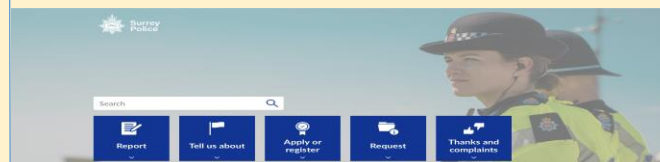

Residential Burglaries	31 (7)	15 (7)	15 (8)
Keyless Car Theft	4	5	2

(-) Actual residential burglaries only, not including - Attempted, Garage and Outbuilding Burglaries

The crime statistics for the last 3 months show consistent number of actual residential burglaries. After a recent increase, in the level of keyless car thefts, there has been a marked decrease in May.
